Membership

- The council will be composed of VCU alumni who have graduated within the last 10 years.
- Complete and submit an application and interview.
- Interviews will take place with the Office of Alumni Relations staff, VCU Alumni board members, and/or alumni volunteer leaders.
- The term of membership will be from July 1-June 30, with a minimum of two years commitment.
- There will be no less than 10 and no more than 30 members per term.
- The application will open March 1 and close April 30.
- Not required to live in the Richmond area.

Benefits

- Build relationships with current board members from VCU Alumni, MCVAA as well as across the university.
- Attend events sponsored by the Office of Alumni Relations.
- Access to alumni leaders and university administrators.

Expectations and Responsibilities

- Attend and participate in quarterly meetings (at least 3 of the 4 is required), virtual or in-person.
- Advocate and support alumni programs and events as well as familiarize yourself with all programs and activities sponsored, organized, and coordinated by the office.
- Connect with Students Today, Alumni Tomorrow, the student alumni association.



Recent Graduate Council

- Plan an event or contribute to the development of recent graduate programming with the Office of Alumni Relations.
- Join and follow all Office of Alumni Relations social media channels.
- Assist in the identification and recruitment of new volunteers.
- Serve a minimum two-year commitment.
- Attend at least two Office of Alumni Relations sponsored events per year.
- Maintain confidentiality with pertinent University information. Volunteers are expected to agree to the confidentiality agreement, conflict of interest disclosure statement, and volunteer agreement.
- Support the Office of Alumni Relations by completing at least half of the items on the action plan. Action plan items may include:
  - Make any size gift to the VCU Alumni Annual Fund.
  - Purchase a ticket to Alumni Stars or Alumni Service Awards.
  - Host/co-host a Dinner for Alumni event with Students Today, Alumni Tomorrow.
  - Volunteer to assist with an Office of Alumni Relations event.
  - Participate in an industry networking event.
  - Volunteer at an Alumni Day of Service event.
