Our actions and their results don't always follow a straightforward path. I think all of us who have lived through this tumultuous year can agree to that! I'm currently a dancer at Ballet West in Salt Lake City after dancing with Boston Ballet last year. Unlike most professional dancers, I didn't start ballet until I was 13. Ballet found me through musical theatre. Starting ballet that late, I had a lot of extra work to do. It was my first love, and since your first love is the one you always fall hardest for, I was willing to push myself.

Just before my freshman year of high school, an alumni of Interlochen happened to guest teach at the ballet school where I was dancing and recommended Interlochen to me. That chance encounter coupled with the generous scholarship I was offered through the Interlochen Annual Fund offered a gateway to an experience that I am so lucky, so fortunate, so grateful to have had.

There is a direct line from your Annual Fund gifts to me as a young black man now dancing in a professional ballet company. I'm shattering glass ceilings and taking strides in places where others were never offered room. I'm helping this art form live into the future and make very needed progress. Do you know your generosity can have that kind of effect? It's astounding to me! Mr. Morrissey saw the potential for a professional career within me and gave me the high caliber training and performance experience I'd need to meet my goal. At Interlochen, I got to dance

roles that my colleagues in Boston Ballet and Ballet West haven't even performed yet. By believing in me, he helped me believe in myself.

This year has been difficult. I can't change that, but what I can do is keep pushing forward. *I'm ready to be a positive force in the world.
