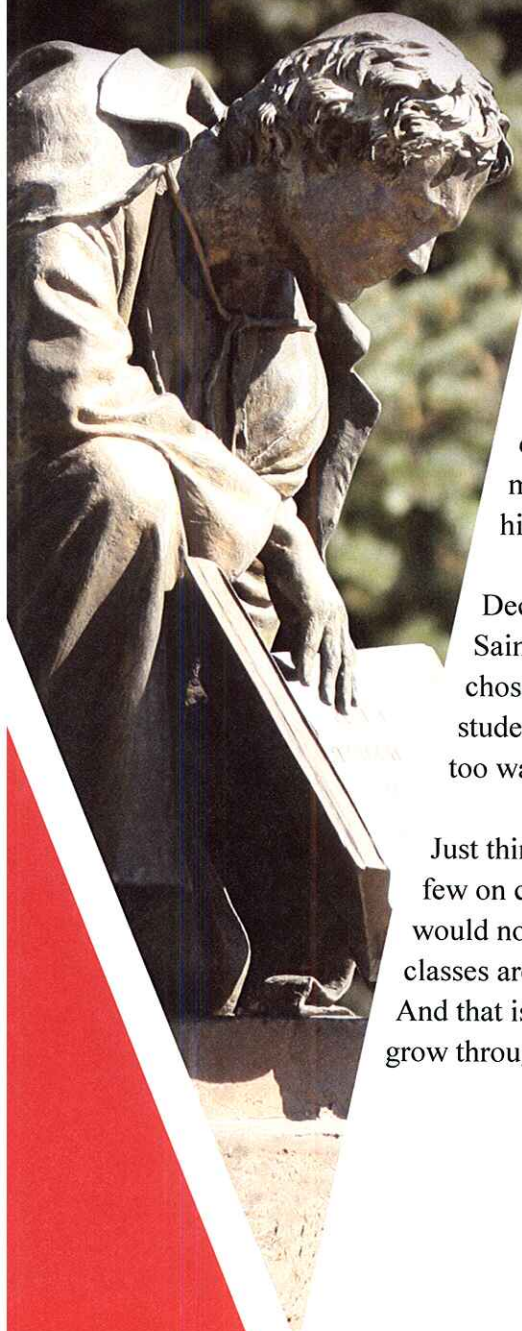
Dear «Saluation»,

The Baryls are a Saint Mary's family. My dad (Tom Baryl) was the first to graduate in 1958. During his time on campus, Saint Mary's was a strictly undergraduate college, and the only female students were over on the Saint Teresa campus. He lived in Aquinas Hall and, for a time, in the powerhouse. Cars were a rarity at the school, and hitchhiking from Chicago to Winona was considered a "safe" way to travel, as Dad proved more than once!

By the 1980s, I was proud to follow in my dad's footsteps, although my Saint Mary's experience was *a little* different than his. I lived in Skemp Hall for two years, and by then women were fully integrated into every major. During my time, Saint Mary's joined the NCAA as a Division III school and changed its mascot to the Cardinals. No longer just undergraduate, Saint Mary's also expanded its graduate program offerings not just in Winona, but also the Twin Cities. And, like many of my fellow students at the time, I had my own car. (Dad wouldn't let me hitchhike.)

Decades apart and different as they were, Dad and I both had experiences at Saint Mary's that were rich, transformative, and relevant to the life paths we chose. The university was able to meet the needs of such vastly different student populations because, like our personal transformations as students, so too was Saint Mary's transforming over the years.

Just think of the computer: Mostly unheard of during Dad's time, there were a few on campus during my time (although I never used them). Today, education would not be possible without them. They are not only ubiquitous, but online classes are an in-demand format and a major area of expansion for the university. And that is just one instance of the many ways the university has had to adapt and grow through the years.



As a Leadership benefactor you already know this, but I'll say it anyway: To consistently provide a leading-edge education like the one at Saint Mary's takes investment. From new equipment and facility upgrades to finding and hiring the right faculty for emerging fields - these are just a few of the expenditures that go with ensuring students are prepared not just for the workforce of today, but for the one of tomorrow as well. 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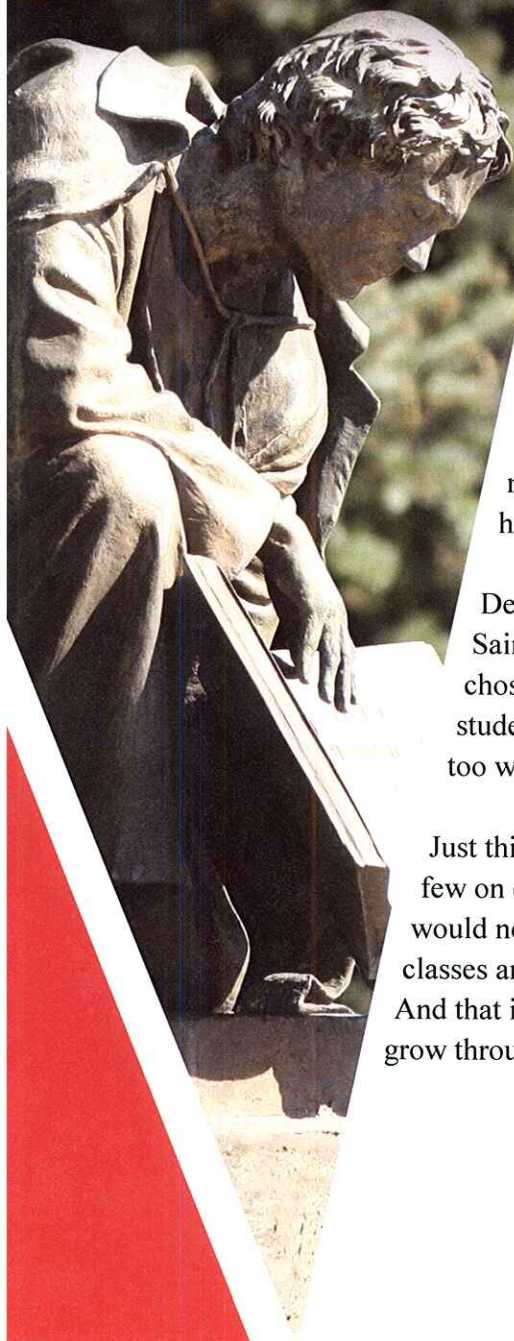
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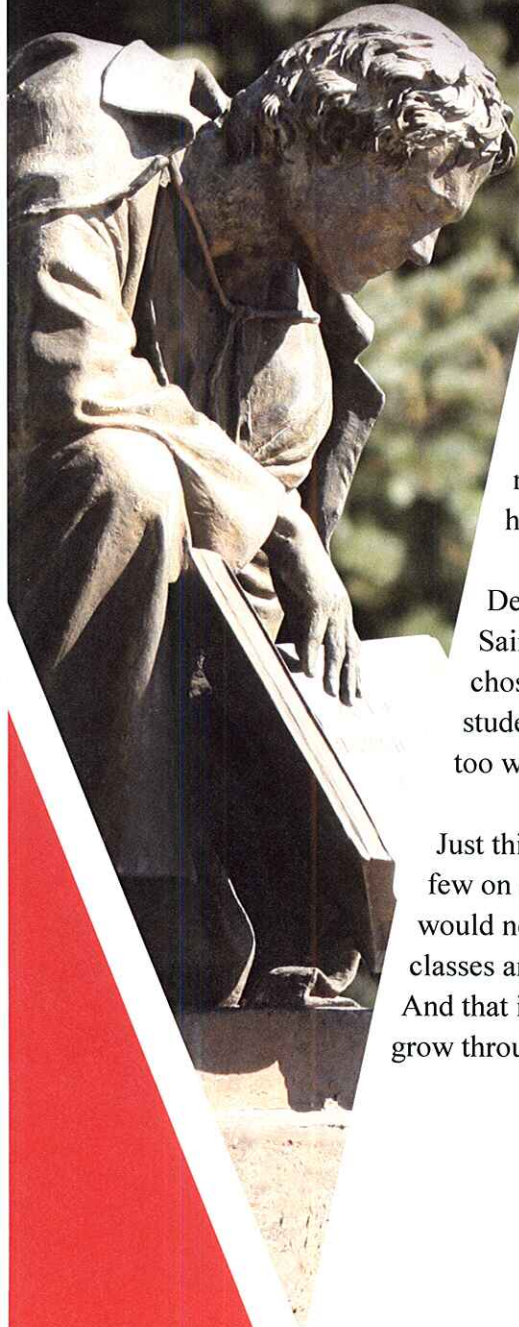

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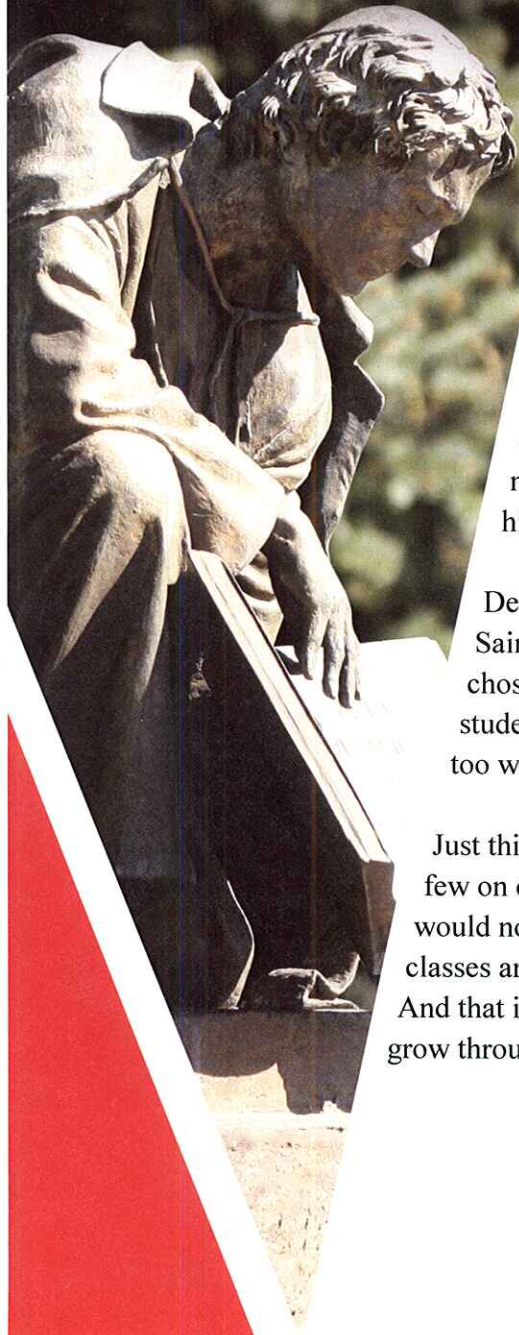
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
