Fundraising Planning

- Set a fundraising goal and theme for your class to rally around
- Make a gift to Parker goal is 100% of our volunteers to make a Reunion Gift by August 1
- Sign appeals that will be sent to your classmates (Parker will provide samples and drafts!)
- Reach out to your classmates to encourage them to join you in making a gift to Parker
- Work with the Alumni Office and Alumni Giving Committee to strategize fundraising unique to your class

Fundraising is an integral part of Reunion Weekend. We will help you every step of the way!



Appeals: timing and details

- Appeals serve two main purposes:
 - Invite and encourage attendance, remind alumni about Reunion Weekend
 - Invite classmates to make a gift to Parker
- Appeals are also known as solicitations or letters
- We will provide a letter template for you to personalize as you see fit
- Can be signed by all volunteers in the class
- Note: We will never send a letter with your signature without your consent.

Idea #2: Encourage Giving

Inspire classmates with a giving challenge!

Some examples/ideas include:

- Invite a small group of classmates to offer up a challenge "pot" of money if the class raises a certain amount of money
- Have a lead donor offer to match gifts made to Parker up to a certain dollar amount
- A donor might agree to make a leadership (aka larger) gift if a certain percentage of classmates donate to Parker



Making it Meaningful

- Auditorium seat
- Giving in honor of a favorite teacher
- Fundraising in memory of a beloved classmate
- Focusing on participation ("our goal is 80% of the class to make a gift!")





Class of 19XX - XXth Reunion!

- 32 RSVPs
- 19 donors (21% participation)
- \$37,973 raised for Parker (Class Gift)

Other 40th Reunions:

- 19XX (in 2016): \$24,535, 14 donors (22%)
- 19XX (in 2018): \$10,410, 14 donors (14%)

June 3	Spring appeal letter to be sent to classmates (signed by you!)
June 1	Deadline to submit Reunion event details by Google Form
June/July	Reunion Program and website editing process
July	Reunion Program heads to printer
July 20	Registration opens online! (Tell your friends!)
July	Letter edits due for summer appeal
August	Summer appeal letter to be sent to classmates (signed by you!)
August	Reunion Program hits mailboxes
Aug/Sep	Attendance and giving updates to be sent to chairs and volunteers (weekly)
Aug/Sep	Emails and social media to encourage Reunion registration and gifts
October 1	Reunion Weekend begins!
October 5	Thank you email to be sent to classmates from Alumni Office (with photos)
October	Letter edits due for fall appeal
November	Fall appeal letter to be sent to classmates (signed by you!)
December	Reunion email for "end of reunion year" to be sent from Alumni Office

- Update YOUR contact information by updating your profile in FWPConnect (or creating a profile it takes 2 minutes!)
- □ Sign the online Confidentiality Agreement (available on FWPConnect)
- Respect security and privacy of fellow alumni
- Share updates with our office (classmates who have moved, gotten married, changed jobs, etc.)
- Plan your Reunion Gift our goal is 100% participation for our Reunion volunteers!
- Get a signature on file for signing letters
 - Email a digital signature if you already have one OR
 - Sign a blank piece of paper with a pen, take a photo, and email it to us
 - □ Note: We will only print your signature with your permission!
